

KIKO RoundupSale Rules

General Information

1. The Sale will be referred to as the 2012 Kiko Roundup Sale in publications.
2. The Sale will be held on Saturday, June 2, 2012.
3. The Sale will be limited to approximately 120 animals.
4. Requests for sale spaces will open February 10 and closed April 15.
5. There will be 3 divisions of goats. The goat Divisions are as follows
 - a. 100% New Zealand
 - b. Purebred
 - c. Percentage and Alternate programs
6. All animals must be 120 days old or older to be placed in the sale, unless sold as a nursing kid.
7. Entries into each division are limited to
 - a. 85 New Zealand and Purebred animals
 - b. 30 Percentage or Alternative Program animals.
8. Maximum number of animals any one member can consign is six (6) unless more are authorized by the Board of Directors or President.
9. Every 100% New Zealand and purebred must be DNA tested as SV or PV with PV being preferred.
10. A consignor must consign five (5) Doe units in order to consign one (1) Buck.
11. There is no guarantee that a buck will be accepted.
12. If the number of Members consigning Bucks exceeds the limits of the sale a lottery will be used to select Bucks to be sold.
13. Anyone that is not a member of the SEKGA will be charged \$50 to consign animals to the sale. Applications can be filled out and submitted at any time.
14. All animals 120 days old or older must have a state or federal scrapie tag in their ear.
15. Does with nursing kids are considered as one (1) unit and can be from any division.
16. The payment of a \$30.00 consignment fee per animal must accompany each consignment request. (The consignment fee will be deducted from expenses at the settlement at the end of the sale).
17. The \$30.00 per head consignment fee will not be refunded for any reason other than entries being rejected for entry into the sale.
18. If a division receives more requests for space than the limit for that division, breeders will be promptly notified and space allotted on a prorated basis to all who have requested entries by the deadline.
19. If a division does not reach its limit, the entries will be reopened for that division until the limit is reached.
20. If a division is not filled by catalog deadline additional entries may be taken from another division that was filled.
21. The total number of goats consigned by each farm may be down sized depending on the total number of goats consigned. Consignors will be notified if this occurs.

22. There will be no private goat sales at the facility during the time it is rented by the SEKGA.
23. Goats that are bought or sold privately at the facility during the time it is rented by the SEKGA will be considered cause for both the buyer and seller being banned from consigning animals to all future SEKGA events.
24. Members may exchange goats that were sold privately prior to the Sale.
25. Members must notify the Sale Manager in advance of the Sale, if exchanging goats sold privately prior to the sale, at the Sale.
26. All the animals sold privately, prior to Sale, must remain in private trucks and trailers or can be placed in a rented pen in the barn, separated from the consigned animals.
27. Consignors to the Sale must register their goats with the AKGA, IKGA or NKR.
28. SEKGA will coordinate the auction as a service to buyers and sellers.
29. SEKGA is not responsible for the health or pedigree information of the animals in the sale.
30. All agreements or guarantees are between the buyer and the seller.
31. All goats are sold as is and become the property of the buyer at the drop of the gavel.
32. Potential buyers are cautioned to examine animals carefully before hand and have all questions answered before the start of the sale.
33. The gender of nursing kids is not a consideration.

CONSIGNMENTS

1. Consignor's Information Sheet must be completed for each consignor and sent to the Sales Manager as specified by the Host.
2. A Consignor's Information Sheet will be available online or by contacting the Host.
3. Consignors will use the name on their registration certificates as their consignor identification.
4. All goats 120 days or older and WEANED AT LEAST 2 WEEKS by sale day, consigned to the Sale, must be AKGA or IKGA or NKR registered.
5. No animals except cataloged animals, will be allowed in the Sale except replacement animals, as referred to in #11 of this section.
6. All consignors must provide the Sale Manager or his agent, the required information for the catalog including a copy of the registration or application for registration plus copies of sire and dame registration no later than the deadline established by the host.
7. All goats 120 days old or older as of sale date, consigned to the auction, must have all registration application requests IN the registrars office approximately 6 weeks prior to sale date. All 100% New Zealand and Purebred animals must include DNA kit requests.
8. Sufficient time must be allowed to get the DNA completed – (4 to 8 weeks if there are no problems). DNA discrepancies may exceed the 8 week time limit to complete.
9. An animal is considered consigned upon receipt of a copy of the registration certificate, \$30.00 entry fee and a completed Consignor's Information Sheet by the Sale Manager and can NOT be withdrawn to be sold privately.
10. If SEKGA discovers a deception concerning the withdrawal of consigned animals, the consignor will be banned from consigning animals to all future SEKGA events.

11. A substitution for a consigned animal will be allowed if the original animal becomes ill, injured or dies before sale date.
12. Notification of the substitution must be given to the Sale Manager before sale date.
13. The consignor of an animal that is not successfully sold in the auction will have all documents presented at the unloading of that animal, returned along with a release for that animal when the consignor's account is settled in the office.
14. No animal will be removed from the barn without a release form issued by the office.
15. Late mailing of applications will not be a consideration for an exception.

Animal Check in

1. Check-in will be from 8:00 am until 10:00 pm the Friday before sale.
2. Goats may be checked in earlier by prior arrangement through the Sale Manager.
3. Upon unloading, consignors will present the following documents to the check-in foreman for each animal consigned in separate manila envelopes:
 - a. An Official interstate health certificate signed by a federally accredited veterinarian that has been issued within 30 days of the sale.
 - b. All animals may be listed on one health certificate but Consignor must provide a duplicate copy for each consigned animal with that animal identified in some matter.
 - c. Original registration papers
 - d. Copy of registration papers
 - e. Signed transfer paper
 - f. Copy of transfer paper
 - g. Copy of health certificate
 - h. No animal will be allowed to be penned or sold if deemed by the examining committee, to exhibit or be suspicious of exhibiting, any of the following conditions:
 - i. Active contagious ecthyma {orf} lesions
 - ii. Caseous Lymphadenitis {CL} lesions
 - iii. Skin infection or mange
 - iv. Draining eye lesions
 - v. Foot root
 - vi. External parasites
 - vii. Emaciation
 - viii. Other infectious diseases
4. Health requirements will be strictly enforced.
5. Regardless of federal or state health laws – the Health Requirements of this Sale “MUST BE MET” in order to be in the Kiko Roundup Sale.
6. All animals are subject to an examination by an Examining Committee appointed by the Board. This committee will have the authority to deny access to the sale or cause the removal from the sale of any animals they deem unfit for sale or in violation of the identification and health requirements.
7. The Examining Committee may seek the advice of a veterinarian if they choose.

8. The decision of the Examining Committee will be final.

IDENTIFICATION

1. Each goat in the Kiko Roundup Sale must be 120 days old and WEANED AT LEAST 2 WEEKS and have the following:
 - a. Goats 120 days old or older as of the sale date.
 - b. A valid AKGA or IKGA or NKR registration certificate.
 - c. A completed and signed transfer form.
 - d. 100% New Zealand and Purebred must show DNA status.
 - e. Goats 90 days old or younger as of the sale date. [doe with kids]
 - f. A completed and signed application for registration.
 - g. A completed and signed transfer form.
 - h. Does consigned as Pregnant or Exposed.
 - i. A completed and signed sire declaration.
 - j. A completed and signed transfer form.
2. Exceptions to this rule will be allowed if there is a letter from the registrar stating the DNA is complete and registration paperwork is being processed due to unexpected circumstances.
3. Late mailing of applications will not be a consideration for an exception.
4. Every goat 120 days old or older on sale day and consigned must have readable tattoos or readable microchips that correspond with their registration certificate.
5. Any consignor using microchips for an animal's personal identification must provide their own reader and help to identify/verify each animal's identity.
6. All goat 120 days old or older as of sale date must have an ear tag or microchip number that corresponds to the identification on the registration certificate.
7. Kids 90 days and younger as of sale date must have an ear tag number that corresponds to the identification on their application for registration and transfer.
8. All animals will be visually identified with their catalog number upon unloading.
9. All animals 120 days old or older as of sale date must have a state or federal scrapies tag in their ear.
10. Identification requirements "MUST BE MET" in order to be in the Showcase Sale. There will be no exceptions to this rule.

LOAD OUT

1. No animal will be removed from the barn without a release form from the office.
2. Release forms will be issued when all accounts have been settled.
3. Health certificates received at check in are no longer valid for intrastate transport after the sale.

COMISSIONS AND CHARGES

1. All sales transactions concerning goats consigned to the Sale must go through the office.
2. A commission of 10% will be charged on all animals consigned to and sold at the Sale.
3. A commission of 10% will be charged on all animals not successfully sold at the sale but sold privately later that day.
4. A commission of 10% will be charged on the final bid offered on any animal that the consignor chooses to “No Sale / Pass Out” during the auction.
5. The transfer fee on all goats as of the sale date will be deducted from the sale price of each animal sold at the Sale.
6. The registration fee on all goats 120 days old or younger as of the sale date will be deducted from the sale price of each animal sold at the Sale.
7. A \$10.00 pen set-up fee will be deducted form proceeds for each pen used by each consigner.
8. The DNA fee on any goats 120 days or younger as of the sale date will be deducted from the sale price of each animal sold at the Sale.
9. Total consignment fees paid by a member will be deducted from the commission charged for selling their animals at the Sale.

BUYERS

1. All buyers' will be required to fill out a Buyers Information form.
2. All buyers' will have their driver's license photo-copied when assigned a buyer's number.
3. All non-members will be given a buyer's number with a different sequence.
4. Any buyer paying with a personal check will be required to thumb print their check.
5. All registration papers on goats paid for with a personal check will be held by the registrar until the check clears the bank.
6. Buyer's and Consignor's accounts must be settled in the office before any animal (whether bought, sold or no saled / passed out) can be removed from the barn.
7. Consignors that both sell and buy animals will have the amount of their purchases deducted from the amount of their sales. If there is a balance owed to the consignor, a check from the SEKGA will be issued to the consignor.
8. If a consignor gives a personal check for animals purchased and request that a check be issued by the SEKGA for the animals sold by that consignor then the registration certificates of the purchased animals will be held by the registrar until the check clears the bank.
9. Consignors can pick up a check for the animals sold {minus the deduction of their purchases, commission charges and paperwork fees} at the auction that day when settling their account at the office.
10. All guarantees of animals are between buyers and sellers. The SEKGA and Host holds NO responsibility on any guarantees given by a consignor.

PAYMENT

1. Payment may be made by one {1} of four {4} ways:
 - a. Deduct from animals sold at sale.
 - b. Cash
 - c. Money order
 - d. Personal check

SPECIAL NOTICE

1. The ratio of five {5} doe units to one {1} buck unit as well as the number of entries allowed by each Member may be down sized depending on the total number of goats consigned to the Sale.
2. After the number of MEMBERS consigning to the Sale has been determined a lottery may be necessary to select Bucks to be sold.

ADVERTISING

Advertisements to be displayed in the KIKO Roundup Sale Catalog must be submitted to the host by the deadline determined by SEKGA with appropriate fees.
